ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

(Life Skill Course)

(Total hours of Teaching – 30 Hrs. @ 02 Hrs. per Week)

Course objective: A Generic Course intended to create awareness that the life of human beings is an integral part of environment and to inculcate the skills required to protect environment from all sides.

Learning outcomes: On completion of this course the students will be able to

1. Understand the nature, components of an ecosystem and that humans are an integral part of nature.
 2. Realize the importance of environment, the goods and services of a healthy biodiversity, dependence of humans on environment.
 3. Evaluate the ways and ill effects of destruction of environment, population explosion on ecosystems and global problems consequent to anthropogenic activities.
 4. Discuss the laws/ acts made by government to prevent pollution, to protect biodiversity and environment as a whole.
 5. Acquaint with international agreements and national movements, and realize citizen's role in protecting environment and nature.
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Unit 1: Environment and Natural Resources 06 Hrs.

1. Multidisciplinary nature of environmental education; scope and importance.
2. Man as an integral product and part of the Nature.
3. A brief account of land, forest and water resources in India and their importance.
4. Biodiversity : Definition; importance of Biodiversity - ecological, consumptive, productive, social, ethical and moral, aesthetic, and option value.
5. Levels of Biodiversity: genetic, species and ecosystem diversity.

Unit-2: Environmental degradation and impacts 10Hrs

1. Human population growth and its impacts on environment; land use change, land degradation, soil erosion and desertification.
2. Use and over-exploitation of surface and ground water, construction of dams, floods, conflicts over water (within India).
3. Deforestation: Causes and effects due to expansion of agriculture, firewood, mining, forest fires and building of new habitats.
4. Non-renewable energy resources, their utilization and influences.
5. A brief account of air, water, soil and noise pollutions; Biological, industrial and solid wastes in urban areas. Human health and economic risks.
6. Green house effect - global warming; ocean acidification, ozone layer depletion, acid rains and impacts on human communities and agriculture.
7. Threats to biodiversity: Natural calamities, habitat destruction and fragmentation, over exploitation, hunting and poaching, introduction of exotic species, pollution, predator and pest control.

Unit 3: Conservation of Environment 10 Hrs

1. Concept of sustainability and sustainable development with judicious use of land, water and forest resources; afforestation.
2. Control measures for various types of pollution; use of renewable and alternate sources of energy.
3. Solid waste management: Control measures of urban and industrial waste.
4. Conservation of biodiversity: In-situ and ex-situ conservation of biodiversity.
5. Environment Laws: Environment Protection Act; Act; Wildlife Protection Act; Forest Conservation Act.
6. International agreements: Montreal and Kyoto protocols; Environmental movements: Bishnois of Rajasthan, Chipko, Silent valley.

Suggested activities to learner: (4 hours)

1. Visit to an area to document environmental assets: river/ forest/ flora/fauna, etc
2. Visit to a local polluted site-Urban/Rural/Industrial/Agricultural site.
3. Study of common plants, insects, birds and basic principles of identification.
4. Study of simple ecosystems-forest, tank, pond, lake,mangroves etc.
5. Case study of a Forest ecosystem or a pond ecosystem.



TUBERCULOSIS AWARENESS PROGRAMME (25-02-2023)

On 25th February 2023, Tuberculosis (TB) awareness programme was organized by the NSS unit of PVKN Govt. College (A), Chittoor in the college auditorium to spread awareness on TB to the students and staff members. The main speaker of the TB awareness program is Sri S. Mohana Prasad, District Tuberculosis Centre (DTC)-Senior Treatment Supervisor (STS) Chittoor. He briefly explained about the early symptoms, modes of tuberculosis transmission, identification of tuberculosis suspects and finally about the prevention of tuberculosis through power point presentation. He appealed the college students to spread awareness on TB to their family members, friends, neighbours and the entire village to execute the slogan as “TB Harega Des Geetega” to end TB. His team also distributed pamphlets indicating causes, symptoms and treatment for TB. 200 students and staff utilized the programme. Dr. P. Bhanuprakash, NSS PO appreciated the DTC-STs and his team for organizing the awareness activity on Tuberculosis and its control in the college. He also appealed to the audience to convey the message to their parents and friends.



DISTRIBUTION OF ALBENDAZOLE TABLETS AND AWARENESS ON SEASONAL DISEASES (23-09-2022)

On 23rd September 2022, NSS units of PVKN Govt. College (A), Chittoor distributed Albendazole tablets (deworming medicine) to the students of college whose age falls around 18 years. Govt. of Andhra Pradesh supplied the required Albendazole tablets through Local ANM from the Health Centre, Chittoor. NSS volunteers actively distributed the deworming tablets to the students of the college by explaining the dosage and importance of the drug.

On the same day, awareness programme on seasonal diseases like Dengue, Malaria, etc was organized through NSS. ANM, Asha worker and NSS volunteers distributed pamphlet and created awareness on the causes, symptoms and prevention tips of the seasonal diseases. Dr. P. Bhanuprakash, Dr. N. Ramamurthy, Dr. A. Sasikala, Sri. Anil and NSS volunteers participated in the programme.

FREE HEMOGLOBIN TEST CAMP (14-02-2023)

A free hemoglobin (Hb) testing camp is organized by NSS unit of the college with the help of the Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) of Greampet ward on 14th February, 2023 in the Chemistry wing of the college. The hemoglobin (Hb) test camp was inaugurated by Dr. G. Ananda Reddy, Principal, PVKN Govt. College (A), Chittoor. A total of 170 girl students and 40 teaching staff blood samples are collected and hemoglobin tests are performed by the ASHA workers. After diagnosis, the students with low percentages of hemoglobin were suggested to use Iron and folic acid supplements to improve their hemoglobin levels. Iron and folic acid supplements were dispensed free of cost by our NSS Volunteers under the supervision of ASHA team. Students were counseled by NSS Volunteers regarding dietary intake to be followed to improve their hemoglobin levels.

Dr. P. Bhanuprakash and Dr. N. Ramamurthy-NSS Programme officers, Lt. A. Ramesh-NCC officer, Dr. P. Sujana-IQAC Coordinator, Dr. A. Sasikala- WEC coordinator and NSS volunteers have been actively involved in the free hemoglobin (Hb) camp.



DEWORMING TABLETS DISTRIBUTION DRIVE (16-03-2023)

On 16th March, 2023 NSS unit of the college organized Albendazole-Deworming tablets distribution drive with the help of the Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) of Greampet ward in the college. The deworming pills prevent illnesses such as worm infections, and also prevent malnutrition and anaemia.

NSS volunteers distributed deworming tablets to all the first-year students of the college. More than 200 students get benefitted from this drive. Dr. P. Bhanuprakash-NSS Programme officer, Sri. A. Ramesh, Dr. D. Srividya and Sri O. Hari Prasad-Lecturers in Chemistry and NSS volunteers have been actively involved in the activity.



The overarching aim of education is the holistic development of students. The changes in the society like urbanization, technological advancement and effects of mass media has led to the need that schools should not only be for nurturing the cognitive development of its students but also for fostering their affective and psycho- motor abilities which would equip them for life

PVKN GOVT COLLEGE (A) CHITTOOR envisages that education imparted in this institute should be such that the learners will be able to develop their talents to the fullest potential. By placing equal importance to both scholastic and co scholastic abilities, children and young people will acquire life skills that will help them to, know their rights, articulate their concerns, build self-esteem, develop self-confidence and resilience and counter negative emotions of stress shame and fear. It would also enhance their ability to take on responsibility for self, build relationships with others in the society and contribute in nation building. These skills can be enhanced through an experiential rather than theoretical approach.

Eco-Clubs in College :

Eco clubs in college will empower students to participate and take up meaningful environmental activities and projects. It is a forum through which students can reach out to influence, engage their parents and neighborhood communities to promote sound environmental behavior. It will empower students to explore environmental concepts and actions beyond the confines of a syllabus or curriculum. While everyone, everywhere, asserts the importance of 'learning to live sustainably,' environment remains a peripheral issue in the formal schooling system.

Objectives of Eco-clubs in the College:

- Motivate the students to keep their surroundings green and clean by undertaking plantation of trees.
- Promote ethos of conservation of water by optimizing the use of water.
- Motivate students to imbibe habits and life style for minimum waste generation, source separation of waste and disposing the waste to the nearest storage point.
- To develop skills of observation, experimentation, survey, recording, analysis, reasoning needed for conserving environment through activities
- Organise seminars, debates, lectures and popular talks on environmental issues in the college to motivate the students to keep their surroundings green and clean.
- Promote ethos of conservation of water by optimizing the use of water and cleaning of water body in the adjacent area.
- Motivate students to imbibe habits and life style for minimum waste generation, source separation of waste and disposing the waste to the nearest storage point.
- Educate students to create awareness amongst public and sanitary workers, so as to stop the indiscriminate burning of waste which causes respiratory diseases.

- Sensitize the students to minimize the use of plastic bags, not to throw them in public places as they choke drains and sewers, cause water logging and provide breeding ground for mosquitoes.
- Organize tree plantation programmes, awareness programmes such as quiz, essay, painting competitions, rallies, nukkad natak etc. regarding various environmental issues and educate children about re-use of waste material & preparation of products out of waste
- Campaign against use of loud speakers, motivate students not to use crackers and fire works, recycling of glass and metals, use of unnecessary horns.
- Field visit to environmentally important sites including polluted and degraded sites, wildlife parks, etc.
- Organise rallies, marches, human chains and street theatre at public places with a view to spread environmental awareness.
- Action based activities like tree plantation, cleanliness drives both within and out side the school campus.
- Grow kitchen gardens, maintain vermin-composting pits, construct water harvesting structures in school, practice paper recycling etc.
- Prepare inventories of polluting sources and forward it to enforcement agencies.
- Maintenance of public places like parks, gardens both within and out side the school campus.
- Mobilise action against environmentally unsound practices like garbage disposal in unauthorised places, unsafe disposal of hospital wastes etc.
- Beautify selected road side area with plants and flowers and put campaign boards to generate awareness.


